

# Categorizing Genesis 1

## Using Assumptions from the Foundations Chapter

This chapter of this Big History supplement examine the text of Genesis 1 in a detailed fashion. These detailed examinations of Genesis 1 build upon the three reasonable assumptions from the Foundations chapter.

1. The Hebrew word **yôm** that is translated as **day** in English can be appropriately interpreted as a long period of time
2. The point of view or frame of reference for the events in Genesis 1 is from the perspective of an observer near the surface of the earth
3. Some of the text in Genesis 1 may be metaphorical or may directly describe some wisdom or purpose from the Creator about what has been created. Such passages are less subject to direct scientific examination. However, the remaining passages in Genesis 1 that describe specific physical events are more open to scientific examination. Those passages that *are* more open to scientific examination will receive most of our attention in the chapters of the Big History supplement.

## Categorizing Genesis 1 Passages into Three Categories

Based on these three reasonable assumptions, we have created a set of tables below. In these tables, all of the passages in Genesis 1 are classified into one of **three categories**.

1. Passages that seem metaphorical. (denoted by METAPHOR in the table below)
2. Passages that seem to be declarations or assessments from the Creator and so are less subject to examination from a scientific perspective. (denoted by CREATOR in the table below)
3. Passages that seem to be more descriptive of a physical event and so can be more easily examined from a scientific perspective. From a scientific perspective, each time period could vary and could cover a relatively long period of time from a human standpoint. (denoted by SCIENCE in the tables below)

## This is One of Many Possible Categorizations for Genesis 1

This is, of course, only one of many ways to categorize the passages of Genesis 1. Since the Bible was meant to be relevant throughout mankind's history and was written by a Being with intelligence that is well beyond human comprehension, it is reasonable to assume that our Creator has written Genesis 1 in such a way that there could be several valid ways

to classify passages in Genesis 1. For example, one valid approach would be to view Genesis 1 as a message to help ancient Israelites to understand how their God was different from the other gods around them. Another valid approach to understanding Genesis 1 could be as a message that shows the triumph of light over darkness, of order over chaos. Another valid message from Genesis 1 is the importance of Sabbath rest, which becomes part of the law given to Moses on Mount Sinai.

Similarly, it may be valid approach in our time, given our scientifically oriented culture, to view Genesis 1 as a text that accurately describes many of the creation events over billions of years - if indeed each of those descriptions in Genesis 1 can be shown to have a corresponding scientific description. It would seem appropriate for the beyond-genius Creator of this universe to create Scripture passages that can have different perspectives as long as the messages in the overall text of the Scriptures remain consistent.

### The Profundity of Harmony Between Science and Genesis 1 Physical Events

In the tables below, we identify 14 events in Genesis 1 that appear to be good candidates for describing a physical event that can be examined from a scientific perspective. For these 14 physical events from Genesis 1, two significant aspects can be noted. The first aspect is that each physical event corresponds to something that has been described by mainstream science, using appropriate assumptions (which are covered in detail in the later chapters of this supplement). The second aspect is that these 14 physical events from Genesis 1 are in the same order as described by current mainstream science, using the assumptions that are described in the chapters of this supplement. This harmony between Genesis 1 physical events and descriptions from modern science is too improbable to be coincidental. Since Genesis 1 was written over 3000 years ago then this harmony is a strong witness that the Creator is the ultimate divine author of the Bible. As mentioned throughout this supplement, this harmony between Genesis 1 and science would suggest that reading Genesis 1 from this scientific perspective would be something that our Creator would have wanted us to discover and accept for this period in our history.

### Notes Concerning the Tables

In the tables below, the headings use the Hebrew word “Yôm” for “Day”, as a reminder that the original Hebrew word can have meanings besides a 24 hour day. Genesis passages utilize the New International Version (NIV) translation. This format for the table rows are as follows.
